Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2019-20 educational progress for the Kenowa Hills Public Schools and our schools. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and some requirements of state laws. Our staff is available to help you understand this information. These reports contain the following information:

#### **Teacher Qualification Data**

- Identifies the number and percentage of inexperienced teachers, principals, and other school leaders
- Reports teachers who are teaching with emergency or provisional credentials
- Includes teachers who are not teaching in the subject or field for which they are certified

#### **NAEP Data (National Assessment of Educational Progress)**

- Provides state results of the national assessment in mathematics and reading every other year in grades 4 and 8

#### **Civil Rights Data**

- Provides information on school quality, climate and safety

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For the 2019-20 school year, schools were identified using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or has a graduation rate at or below 67%. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no status label is given.

\* Note TSI and ATS definitions were changed for the 2019-20 school year per federal requirements. The new definitions are:

TSI – The school has at least one subgroup performing in the bottom 25% within each applicable accountability index component.

ATS – The school has met the criteria for TSI identification and has at least one subgroup performing at the same level as a CSI school.

***There are no schools in our district identified as TSI, ATS, nor CSI.***

Also, it is with great excitement and pride that we share Central Elementary was recognized by the Michigan Department of Education as a Reward School. This is a tremendous honor for the Central Elementary learning community! A Reward School, as defined by the state's A-F accountability system, are those that receive the highest grade (in this accountability system, this is an "A") in either student proficiency, student growth, or on the similar school proficiency comparison. Central Elementary received an "A" on the proficiency category; which is a combined rating for student performance on the M-STEP ELA and Math assessments.

Our community continues to play a vital role in the success of our district. We are very proud of the efforts being made to improve the learning for each and every student at KHPS and sincerely appreciate the continued support of parents, staff and our community in this effort.
