



Suggested Elementary Supply List

Over the summer and at the beginning of the school year, our school offices receive numerous phone calls from parents interested in purchasing school supplies for their child. Our schools provide the necessary tools that students will need in the classroom, however, parents are more than welcome to purchase additional supplies for their child if they wish to do so. In order to communicate better to parents and provide a better idea of useful school tools, we have created a suggested elementary supply list for your use. Please keep in mind that some school supplies can be a distraction to learning for our students (ex. fancy pens and pencils). Please try to avoid purchasing items that may cause potential classroom disruptions. If you want to purchase some special or “fun” supplies for your child to use, please create a special study area or basket/box at home for your child’s use.

Student Supplies

- Pencils (#2 and colored)
- Markers (washable and whiteboard)
- Highlighters
- Crayons
- Erasers (large pink-no cap erasers)
- Spiral Notebooks
- Lined Paper
- Folders (manilla, pocket, pocket with 3-prongs, etc.)
- Glue Sticks
- Scissors
- Pencil Cases
- Handheld Pencil Sharpeners
- Ear Buds (headphones)

In addition, in the past, parents have offered to donate various supplies that would benefit the classroom as a whole. Here are some other suggested items that would be of use in the classroom.

Classroom Supplies

- Tissue
- Hand Soap and/or Hand Sanitizer
- Plastic Bags (gallon, quart, and sandwich)
- Paper Plates, Napkins, Forks, Spoons, Disposable Cups
- Whole-Class Healthy Snacks (crackers, pretzels, etc.)
- Bottled Water
- Index Cards
- White-board Markers
- Pencils (#2)
- Band-Aids
